DJOUCE SUMMIT PATH

Work has progressed well on the Djouce summit path over the last few months and we are now nearing completion. We have almost completed **1,600 m of scree walls -** these define the path **- and installed ten waterbars and steps**. More waterbars and steps are needed and we have to tidy up the scree walls on the bottom section before the onset of winter but the next two work days should see it finished.

Well done to all who have contributed to this project- it shows what can be done by hardworking volunteers even if we are still learning our trade and making the odd mistake - trail width!!! Sorry to all concerned. On a visit last Sunday I found that the vast majority of walkers were staying on the path and between the walls - a great result which is allowing the vegetation (heather and grasses) to regenerate on the now "protected" slopes. Conservation works!
